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Introduction

The environmental scan offers an understanding of who is doing what to localize the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) related to ending poverty across the country. The scan includes information about the communities engaged or centered with each project, whether the project develops indicators, whether the project has the stated goal of localizing the SDGs, and whether the project engages with lived and living experts. Other notes relevant to the project as well as the link to learn more are also included. While there are likely more projects working on these issues throughout the country, this scan provides a snapshot of current initiatives and is useful to contextualize Campaign 2000's project.

Criteria

- 1. Initiative has to 'localize' SDGs in some way
- 2. SDG(s) must be related to ending poverty
- 3. If it does not name the SDGs, it should align with the goal of ending poverty (in a holistic sense)
- Must be located in Canada.
- 5. Should localize goals in a concrete way: e.g., target/indicator development, community engagement, community data/measurement/monitoring, increasing inclusivity of SDGs.

Initiatives that are solely centered on awareness (e.g., local events that explain the SDGs) or are not at local community level (e.g. university SDG campaigns that are just within the institution) were not included here.

Methods

Throughout the first few months of research, initiatives encountered through research tasks and project work (including the literature review, policy map, events, and meetings) were scanned for these criteria. If they were a potential match, they were included in a tracking sheet. Several searches specifically for the environmental scan were also conducted, using various combinations of search terms. The list of other projects funded by the Sustainable Development Goals funding program was also reviewed, and relevant projects were added to the tracking sheet. As the initiatives listed in the tracking sheet were reviewed, some new projects/initiatives were added through mention or connection with others, and some were removed if they were not applicable for the scan.

Findings

This version of the scan has resulted in 41 relevant initiatives, presented below in alphabetical order. There is limited information about 13 of these initiatives (likely in their early stages — these are listed at the end of the table). All the initiatives present relevant information, learnings, examples, gaps, or potential connections for the project in some way. While with additional research, there are many other projects or organizations that could be included here, this scan provides a snapshot of current initiatives and useful learnings for the project.
